This representation letter is provided in connection with your audit of the primary government financial statements of Manton Joint Cemetery District, which comprise the respective financial position of the governmental activities as of June 30, 2018, and the respective changes in financial position and for the year then ended, and the related notes to the primary government financial statements, for the purpose of expressing opinions as to whether the primary government financial statements are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Certain representations in this letter are described as being limited to matters that are material. Items are considered material, regardless of size, if they involve an omission or misstatement of accounting information that, in light of surrounding circumstances, makes it probable that the judgment of a reasonable person relying on the information would be changed or influenced by the omission or misstatement. An omission or misstatement that is monetarily small in amount could be considered material as a result of qualitative factors.
